Vision:

"To develop compassionate individuals who think and act with respect and understanding."

Intent:

RE at Graiseley provides children with opportunities to gain a greater understanding of the diversity of their local community. They develop an understanding of beliefs and practices of religions and world views. Christianity and other world religions especially those that are the main faiths of children within our school – Sikhism, Hinduism and Islam are studied. We create a respectful and nurturing environment where children discuss key themes such as differences between people. Through discussion and encouragement children explore and reflect upon their own views and the beliefs and practices of others. We aim for our children to have the essential skills to live and work with people of all beliefs and cultures.

Implementation:

In EYFS RE is taught using the SACRE syllabus. By the time children reach the end of Reception, we expect them to have met the relevant Personal, social and Emotional Development statements and the Understanding the World ELG — Building Relationships, Past and Present and People and Communities, to ensure a good level of RE development when moving into Key Stage One.

Within Key Stage One and Key Stage Two, RE is taught weekly. A total of 4 units are delivered over the year. Equal time is allocated to each unit and this is around 9/10 weeks. The school encourages visits to places of worship (St John's Church during the Autumn term with Years 2 and 4 completing a 'Places of worship' unit and visit a gurdwara, mandir or mosque). Visitors come in regularly to deliver assemblies — Penn Puppets and 'Open the Book'. A range of books and artefacts are used to deliver each unit. Each class performs an annual assembly linked to a festival/celebration.

RE is planned to ensure progression. The Aim of RE in Wolverhampton includes knowing, expressing and gaining skills. Pupils are taught a rich knowledge and understanding of religions and worldviews. They learn to express and communicate ideas. They then gain and deploy the skills needed to engage with religions and worldviews.

Key RE concepts explored and mastered overtime at Graiseley Primary:

- Finding out about Christianity, Sikhism, Islam, Hinduism and Judaism.
- Holy Books
- Bible stories
- Holy places
- Exploring key Leaders
- Visiting places of worship
- Prayer and Community

Impact: By the end of Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1, children will have an understanding of Christianity in Wolverhampton. They will have experienced a range of stories of Jesus and know about important prayers such as The Lord's Prayer. The children will have visited the local Church — St John's and one other place of worship (gurdwara/mandir/mosque). The children will have been introduced to Sikhism and Islam. They will know about their holy books and experienced stories from them. At the end of Key Stage 2 children will have experienced an in depth study of celebrations, leaders, religious founders and linked their work with Wolverhampton communities and charities.
